# UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WILL RISE TO AN UNPRECEDENTED LEVEL DUE TO COVID-19 OUTBREAK.

This is the sentiment in the business community at the moment. Many believe that the global economy will be heading to a recession and Malaysia will not be able to escape from it.

Approximately 5 million people in China lost their jobs within 2 month of 2020 amid the outbreak of Covid-19 in January and February. In the US, more than 700,000 lost their jobs in March and this is excluding about 10 million people that have filed for unemployment insurance in the last 2 weeks of March alone. This will continue to climb as US now reported the highest infected rate of Covid-19 in the world.

Malaysia's unemployment rate will not be spared as industries in retail, restaurants, travel, hotels and leisure, manufacturers are making huge losses and further compounded by the month-long Movement Control Order (MCO). Oil & Gas industry are on the alert as oil prices collapsed and airline industry have grounded to a halt.

The severity of the unemployment rate may slow down by some degree especially with the current stimulus given out by the government. However, many in the business community view it as a short-term relief measure during the MCO period. Businesses would take up to 6 months or longer to recover and they hope the government will review the situation on a timely manner to provide aids to sustain the economy.



## HOW CANDIDATES FARE DURING THIS COVID-19 PERIOD





### Candidates' concerns while applying for job during this period

- Adopting a wait & see strategy until Covid-19 is over before deciding a career move.

- Candidates understand the current situation and know that organisation who are still hiring currently are in a much better position to succeed Covid-19.
- Candidates no longer have confidence with their current Company to sustain during this period.
- Candidates feel there are lesser competition for the job and the best time to secure a job successfully.
